Vision

Shrewsbury International School Phnom Penh (SISPP) is committed to providing a world-class, holistic education for pupils aged 2-18 years old. Building upon the 472-year legacy of Shrewsbury School, UK, and drawing inspiration from best practices in leading UK state and independent schools, SISPP fosters a stimulating and nurturing environment where all children can flourish and reach their full potential.

Principles

- Educational philosophy Floreat ("Flourish"): SISPP upholds the Shrewsbury ethos, encouraging pupils to "flourish" academically, personally, and socially.
- Child-Centred Learning: SISPP prioritises the individual needs and interests
 of each child, fostering a sense of curiosity and a love of learning.
- Play-Based Learning (Early Years): Recognising the importance of play in early development, SISPP offers a rich environment with open-ended resources to encourage exploration, creativity, and social interaction.
- Balanced Curriculum: SISPP provides a balanced curriculum encompassing core subjects like English, mathematics, science, and history, alongside Khmer language and culture, creative arts, physical education, and social and emotional learning.
- Explicit Instruction and Differentiation: SISPP utilises clear and concise explanations alongside differentiated instruction to cater to diverse learning styles and abilities, while also ensuring pupils develop strong English language skills.
- Assessment for Learning: SISPP employs ongoing assessments to identify individual strengths and weaknesses. Teaching strategies are then adapted to ensure continuous progress.

- **Reflective Practice:** SISPP cultivates a culture of continuous improvement through regular self-reflection and collaboration among educators.
- Positive Relationships: SISPP builds strong, positive relationships with pupils, fostering a sense of security and trust that allows them to flourish.
- Engagement with Families: SISPP maintains open communication and collaboration with families, valuing their role as partners in their child's education.
- Global Citizenship: SISPP cultivates a global perspective in its pupils, fostering an understanding and appreciation of diverse cultures.

- Professional Development: SISPP provides ongoing professional development opportunities for educators to keep them abreast of best practices, innovative teaching methods, and the Cambodian context.
